The long-awaited and much anticipated opening of our new main office and Wailuku Branch at Kehalani Village Center has arrived. Our location at 1888 Wili Pa Loop will permanently close on Thursday, March 23rd at 4:30 p.m. and we will be opening at 224 Kehalani Village Drive on Tuesday, March 28th. The hours of operation will be Monday to Friday, 8:30am to 4:30pm.

This new location will double the size of the main office and Wailuku Branch, allowing us to consolidate personnel, expand our services, and provide room for future growth. In addition to continuing to serve our members with personal checking and savings accounts, IRAs, share certificates, loans, mortgages, HELOCs and credit cards, we're adding two drive up Smart ATMs and safe deposit boxes to better serve and meet your needs.

Our drive up Smart ATMs are available 24/7, and like our other Smart ATMs, they can accept envelopeless check and cash deposits and dispense bills in different denominations. In order to protect your information, the debit card slot is landscape, so you'll need to insert your card the long way, which is a best practice for preventing your card information from being stolen. Receipts also have a greater level of detail with copies of checks and counts of bills deposited printed on your

If you're interested in getting a safe deposit box, we have over 600 biometrically secured boxes available in three different sizes: 3" x 10" x 21.25", 5" x $10" \times 21.25"$ and $10" \times 10" \times 21.25"$. Stop by the new Wailuku branch to sign-up for one.

Beginning Saturday, March 25th, Saturday banking from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., will move back to our Kahului Branch at Maui Marketplace. The coin machine has also been relocated from Wailuku to the Kahului Branch.

Our Safety & Soundness

You've likely heard about the recent collapse of two large mainland banks, Silicon Valley Bank and Signature Bank . In light of this news, we want to assure you that your deposits are safe with Maui County Federal Credit Union.

Silicon Valley Bank was a niche bank serving a particular set of customers within the technology industry, including innovative tech start-ups, entrepreneurs, and venture capital firms. The bank was focused on a limited sector, which significantly increased its risk profile. Signature Bank was a New York financial institution with a big real estate lending business that had recently made a play to win cryptocurrency deposits

While this situation does not include any credit union failure, we want to provide you with peace of mind when it comes to your savings at Maui County Federal Credit Union, where we are committed to serving our Maui community. Our first priority is your financial well-being, and focusing on financial security.

High Net Worth

Maui County Federal Credit Union has been in operation for the past 85 years and is well capitalized with a net worth to assets ratio currently above 15%. Well-above the minimum 7% net worth to assets ratio that NCUA uses to be considered "well capitalized". Credit unions are among the most well-capitalized financial institutions, maintaining equity reserves and liquid investments that prioritize necessary safety and soundness for their members.

All Deposits Federally Insured

All deposits at Maui County Federal Credit Union are protected by the National Credit Union Share Insurance Fund, a separate fund not associated with the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation for banks. These credit union deposits are insured for up to \$250,000 per individual depositor. Credit union members have never lost a penny of insured savings at a federally insured credit union, and our industry's deposit insurance fund has the backing of the full faith and credit of the U.S. government.

Credit Unions are Member Owned

Maui County Federal Credit Union is a notfor-profit financial cooperative owned by our members. Our mission is to care for our members' needs and interests by providing services that encourage financial well-being. Like banks, we offer traditional financial products and services to individuals in our community. Unlike banks, we only serve our Maui County community and are not subject to big-profit pressures from investors/stock owners.
